The school directors are very conscientious in looking after school property. The Springs and Chippenhook schools are in very good condition, but some of the others need attention and especially the Flats School. The chimney does not seem to take care of the smoke from the furnace satisfactorily, and consequently the walls and ceiling of the room are soiled and the children are caused considerable discomfort. It may be that the flue to the chimney is not large enough.

The enrollment is gradually increasing in the elementary schools but the number of high school students remains about the same.

It will be noticed that the state rebate is more than usual, which is on account of increase in enrollment, and the running of the East Street school.

The citizens of Clarendon deserve much credit for the standard of schools maintained for many years.

I wish to express my deep appreciation for this excellent spirit of cooperation.
