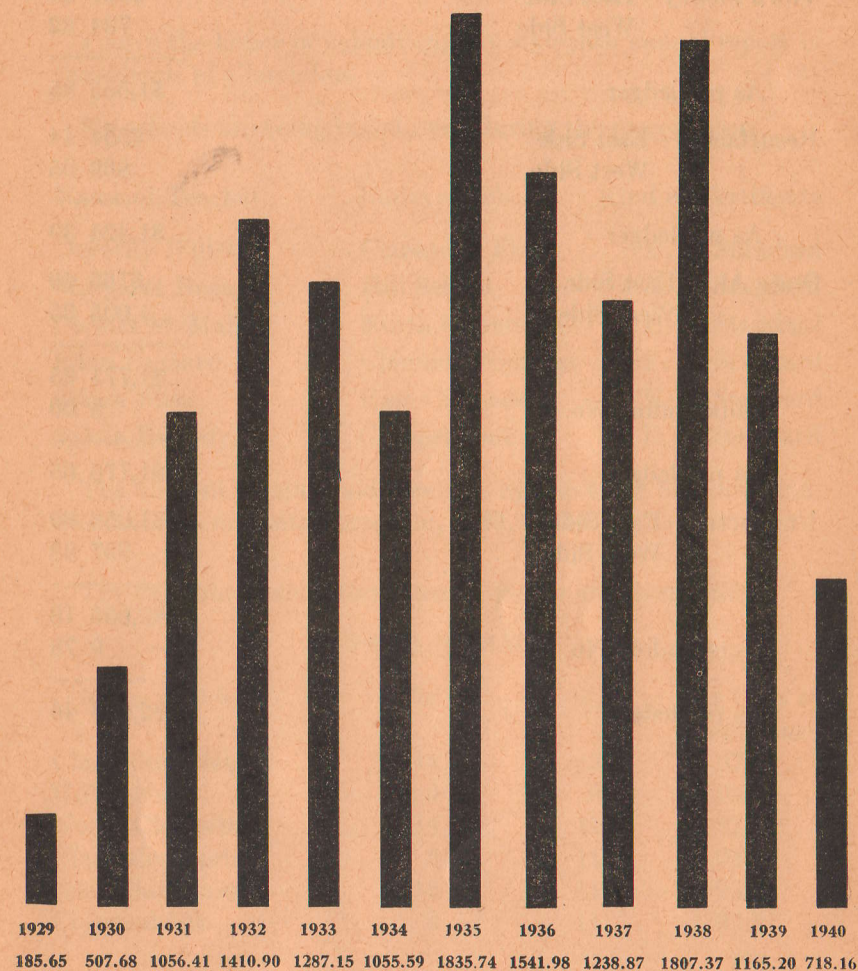

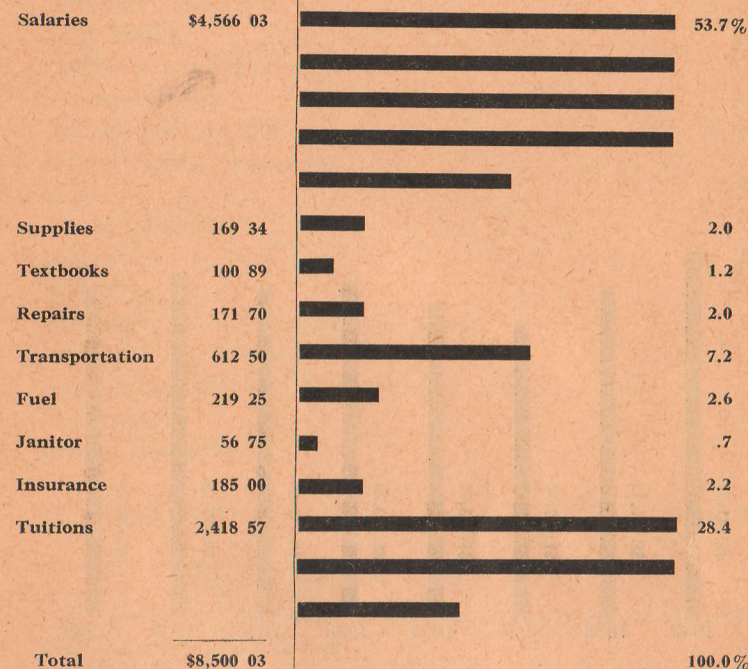

For School Year

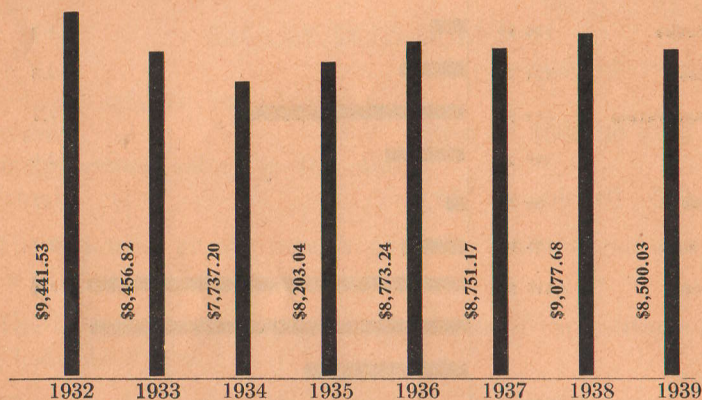
July 1, 1938 to June 30, 1939
